Timothy Hill, UCF Public Administration Student, awarded FSASE Joel Oldmixon Scholarship

Timothy Hill, a UCF student majoring in Public Administration and minoring in Emergency Management and Homeland Security, was awarded a \$1200.00 Scholarship by the Florida State Association of Supervisors of Elections (FSASE) at their 2017 annual conference.

The FSASE annually awards scholarships to students majoring in a number of fields, including Public Administration. Each County is allowed to submit one nominee to the selection committee. Orange County Supervisor of Elections Bill Cowles selected Timothy Hill, one of three outstanding applicants from UCF, for consideration. Timothy was then selected by the scholarship committee to receive the prestigious Joel Oldmixon Scholarship, named after former Escambia County Supervisor of Elections Joel Oldmixon.

The scholarship was presented during the 2017 FSASE Annual Conference Awards Luncheon at the Omni Resort at Champions Gate, in Osceola County. Timothy was able to attend the luncheon and accept his scholarship.
