POLL WORKER POSITIONS

POLL CLERK: \$275 (1)

Supervises the Election Board, picks up supplies the Saturday prior to the election and returns them on election night to a collection site.

VOTING SYSTEM INSPECTOR: \$240 (1)

This poll worker is responsible for the voting equipment, DS200 Tabulator and ADA Voting machine, which includes setting up and closing the polls.

HELP DESK OATH PERSON: \$240 (1)

This poll worker assists voters who present exceptions to the normal voting pattern by checking voter records on a tablet or by calling the Elections Office. Great computer skills are required. (*This poll worker does not need to be an Orange County registered voter*).

ePOLL BOOK INSPECTOR: \$185 (3)

Locates voter's name in the ePoll book (tablet), determines voter's eligibility, and issues voter their ballot. Computer skills are required.

POLL DEPUTY: \$160 (1)

This poll worker maintains order outside the voting room, and assists voters entering and exiting the voting room. (Poll Deputy's must be cleared through the Orange County Sheriff's office).

The Orange County Supervisor of Elections Office invites businesses, non-profits, churches, and schools to partner with us for the purpose of enhancing public confidence in our elections and ensuring the integrity of the electoral process. That is our mission and here is how you can participate.

The Adopt-A-Precinct program is designed to provide community organizations and non-profits with an opportunity to participate in the elections process in Orange County. Each participating organization or business "adopts" a specific precinct, or several precincts, for the election cycle by providing the personnel to staff the Election Board at that precinct. In turn, the Supervisor of Elections writes a check to the organization rather than pay the individual workers. By forming a partnership with the Supervisor of Elections office, fundraising efforts are directed toward a worthwhile cause and the public is served by having qualified workers at the polling places.

In our three 2016 elections over \$419,241.00 was distributed to organizations participating in our Adopt-A-Precinct program!

THE ADOPT-A-PRECINCT PROGRAM:

- Provides community organizations and nonprofits the opportunity to be part of the elections process
- Raises funds for your worthy causes by paying your organization or non-profit rather than the individual poll worker
- Each participating organization or non-profit "adopts" a specific precinct or multiple precincts for each election cycle by providing the personnel to staff the precinct(s)
- ☆ Great team building opportunity for your organization

HOW MUCH CAN YOU EARN?

- Any average Election Board earnings can be up to \$1,470 per precinct, per election (See position listings)
- Additional earnings are possible when you recruit back-up workers and allow us to use them in other precincts
- After working one successful election cycle your group may quality to adopt multiple precincts which increases your earning potential



WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO GET STARTED?

- ☆ Complete the Adopt-A-Precinct Interest Form, then fax or mail it to us
- Once your organization has been approved to become an Adopt-A-Precinct group, you will need to identify a coordinator and at least 9 volunteers (this includes back-up workers and 1 to 3 bilingual Spanish speaking poll workers)
- ★ Volunteers must by registered to vote in Orange County (the Help Desk Oath Person does not need to be registered to vote in Orange County,)
- Make sure all workers attend training, which is mandatory and occurs prior to each election
- Make sure Poll Workers remain non-partisan
- Make sure your poll workers are at work by 6 a.m. The time they will leave varies by election, usually about 1-2 hours after the polls close
- Make sure your poll workers bring food and necessities for the entire day because they cannot leave the voting room during the day
- Remind your poll workers to wear business casual attire.
- ★ Most precincts will require from 1 3 bi-lingual Spanish poll workers. Our office can supply these workers if you can't, however your group will not receive pay for these workers
