

## POLL WORKER POSITIONS AND PAY

### (1) POLL CLERK: \$290

Supervises the Election Board, picks up supplies the Saturday prior to the election and returns them on election night to a collection site.

### (1) ASST. POLL CLERK \$235 (General Only)

Assist the Poll Clerk as needed. Uses mini iPad to assist voters in line determine they are in the correct precinct.

### (1) VOTING SYSTEM INSPECTOR: \$255

This poll worker is responsible for the voting equipment, DS200 Tabulator and ExpressVote®, which includes setting up both and closing the polls.

### (1+) HELP DESK OATH PERSON: \$255

This poll worker assists voters who present exceptions to the normal voting pattern by checking voter records on a tablet or by calling the Elections Office. Computer skills are required. *(This poll worker does not need to be an Orange County registered voter).*

### (3+) ePOLL BOOK INSPECTOR: \$210

Locates voters' names in the ePoll book (tablet), determines voters' eligibility, and issues voters' their ballot. Computer skills are required.

### (1) POLL DEPUTY: \$175

This poll worker maintains order outside the voting room, and assists voters entering and exiting the voting room. (Poll Deputies must be cleared through the Orange County Sheriff's Office.)

We encourage you to recruit at least 2 backups.

## Dear Orange County Business and Community Leader:

The Orange County Supervisor of Elections Office invites businesses, non-profits, churches, and schools to partner with us to:

- Ensure the integrity of the electoral process
- Enhance public confidence
- Encourage citizen participation

The Adopt-A-Precinct program is designed to provide community organizations and businesses with an opportunity to participate in the elections process in Orange County, FL. At the same time, organizations can raise funds for worthy causes in which they are involved. Each participating organization or business “adopts” a specific precinct, or several precincts, on Election Day by providing the workers to staff the Election Board at that precinct. In turn, the Supervisor of Elections writes a check to the group rather than pay the individual workers. By forming a partnership with the Supervisor of Elections Office, fundraising efforts are directed toward a worthwhile cause and the public is served by having qualified workers at the polling place(s).

**With two countywide elections in 2018, over \$262,680 was distributed to organizations participating in the Adopt-A-Precinct program!**

## THE ADOPT-A-PRECINCT PROGRAM:

- ☆ Provides community organizations and businesses the opportunity to be part of the election process.
- ☆ Raises funds for worthy causes by paying your organization or business rather than individual poll workers.
- ☆ Each participating organization or business “adopts” a specific precinct or multiple precincts for each election cycle by providing the personnel to staff the precinct(s).
- ☆ Supervisor of Elections Office will provide a sign outside your polling place with your organizations or business’ name.
- ☆ Your organization or business name will be added to our “Adopt-A-Precinct Partners” wall in the Elections Office.

## \*HOW MUCH CAN YOU EARN?

- ☆ In 2020, average Election Board earnings will be at least \$1,605 per precinct, per election; assuming the group provides a full election board. That is a potential earning of at least \$4815 for the year.
- ☆ Risen Savior Lutheran Church earned over \$5,535 working 2 precincts in 2 elections in 2018.
- ☆ Mokanna Lodge earned \$5,400 working 2 precincts in 2 elections in 2018.
- ☆ Lake Nona High School Band earned \$8,035 working 3 precincts in 2 elections in 2018.
- ☆ Kiwanis Club of Greater Orlando/Winter Park earned \$2700 working 1 precinct in 2 elections in 2018.

*\*New groups can only adopt 1 precinct their first election.*

## WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO GET STARTED?

- ☆ Complete the Adopt-A-Precinct Interest Form. Return it by fax or email it to us.
- ☆ Once your organization or business has been approved to become an Adopt-A-Precinct group, you will need to identify a Coordinator and at least 9 workers (this includes back-up workers and 1 to 3 bilingual (Spanish/Creole) poll workers).
- ☆ Workers must be registered to vote in Orange County.
- ☆ Make sure all workers attend position specific training, which is mandatory and occurs prior to each election.
- ☆ Make sure your poll workers are at their polling location by 6 a.m. The time they will leave varies by election, usually about 2-3 hours after the polls close.
- ☆ Groups may wear their business or organizations logo shirts (no electioneering).
- ☆ Make sure workers bring food and necessities for the entire day because they cannot leave the polling place during the day.
